XL helps ValleyCare's Emergency Department meet patient needs.



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Preplanning, including working directly with hospital staff, played a key role in helping the department run smoothly during construction. Three successful reviews with OSHPD, one for each phase of the project, allowed beds to remain open, and essential systems, including medical gases and nurse call, were upgraded seamlessly throughout continued occupation. With their critical systems updated, ValleyCare Health System is continuing to provide state-of-the-art emergency services to the tri-valley area.

OVERVIEW:

An emergency department remodel in an occupied building. Work was completed in three sequential phases to allow for continued use of the department.

UNIQUE CHALLENGES:

- Project was completed in just 22 weeks without shutting down the urgent care facility
- Emergency department size increased 60 percent with a dozen new rooms and 10 new beds
- Patient services were maintained for critical care utilities including medical gas, electrical and nurse call
- A centralized nursing station was added to improve efficiency and the ability to monitor patients
- Preplanning with OSHPD resulted in streamlined inspections, allowing patient rooms to be occupied within days of construction completion
